Students on Assembly

Each week a class presents and runs the student Assembly. They also perform a song, poem, act, or play about a Virtue. Some of our presentations this month have been on Patience, and Generosity. This gives student the opportunity to practice their Soft Skills in front of a larger audience. Please see on our website a recreation of original research about self-regulation and Patience. 4L students recreated an experiment by Walter Mischel from Stanford University to try to understand when and how children develop skills of self-regulation, and if it is an indicator of future success. His research goes on to explain ways we can teach self-regulation to children.

Soft Skills

Another aspect of **self-confidence** is also currently being taught and that is to develop an understanding of **Self Protection**. Students discussed Good Touches (a friendly handshake or hug) and Bad Touches (a pinch or a hit) and what to do if they feel uncomfortable with someone. They were encouraged to write the names of 5 people they could trust to talk to in a picture of their hand. It was reinforced that each person is the BOSS OF THEIR BODY and they decide how they feel.

Sports Day

The teaching staff and the Student Council are planning for the Sports Day which will take place on Friday October 13 (last day of Term1).

Children are encouraged to wear the colour of their Team (House) on this day. The teams will be Red Dragons, Blue Bears, Green Archers, Yellow Cheetahs.

Good Health

As you know the government has been warning citizens regarding the outbreak of Dengue fever. Our school has been very careful to follow all the guidelines and regularly have Rent-o-kill spray all rooms and buildings. This is carried out late on Friday afternoons and into the evening to ensure the maximum effect and also to allow any smell to disperse before the children occupy the classrooms.
