Fire Drill

Recently the school took part in a planned Fire Drill. The students were taught about safe routes, out of the building and practiced using the fire stairs.

On Friday 3 September all the students and staff including kitchen, janitors, office staff evacuated the building and then the fire brigade demonstrated the reach of their equipment by spraying the building. This was a very orderly exit and all students were out of the building in just under 4 minutes.

This was a planned exit for teaching children the drill and the next occasion will not be at a specific time, so children and staff must react appropriately.

This month saw the appointment of a new Student Council. Candidates had to write a letter of application to the Principal, who checked with the class teacher to ensure they were of good character and work habits.

In the second half of the year, some year 3 students will be introduced to the Council to experience their meetings.

Student Council Activity

The role of the Student Council is to:

- promote the interests and activities of **students** with the school administration,

- consult students on any issue of importance
- organize fundraising for school and charitable activities.

The first project to be undertaken by the Student Council is to collect used toys which will be distributed to the poor children in hospital with Operation Smile. Students must have approval from parents before donating toys to this collection.
